If you have more than one computer, a wireless network will let you share resources among them. Any computer can print on a shared printer located anywhere in the house and your computers can share all kinds of files - music, digital pictures, and documents. Keep all your digital music on one computer, and listen to it anywhere in the house. Organise and keep all of your family's digital pictures in one place, so it's easy to find the ones you want and make backup copies on CD or DVD. Use extra free space on one computer when another's hard drive starts to fill up. Play computer games either across your network or over the Internet.

If you have a cable or broadband Internet connection, a home network will allow all your computers to share the line. Everybody can keep a private e-mail account and surf the web at the same time.

Plus, shared Internet access also helps to protect your computers from Internet threats using a router firewall.

- Back-up

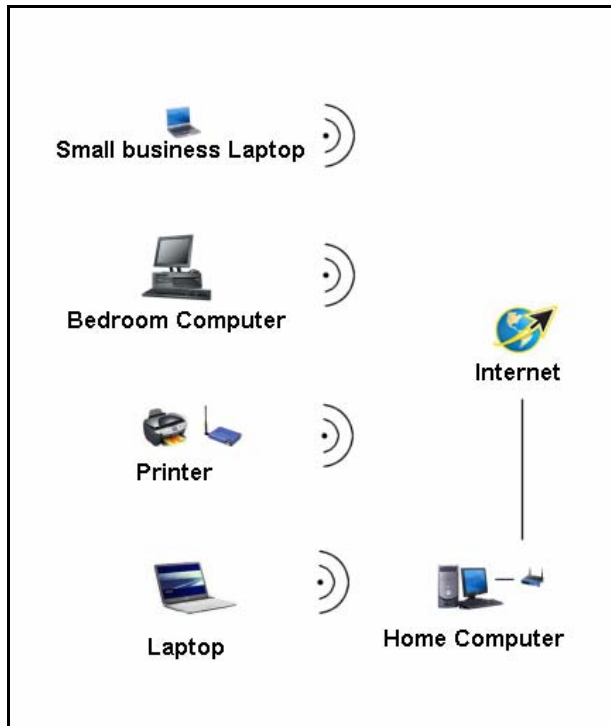
